### Endometriosis, what is it?

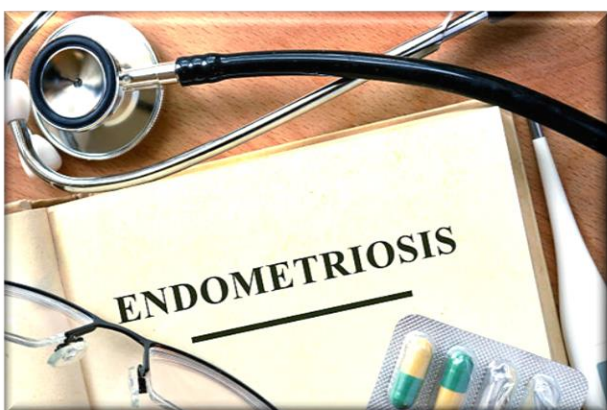
**Endometriosis** is a disorder in which tissue usually lining the uterus grows outside it. The most common [symptoms](#) are pelvic pain, period pain, cramps, and menstrual irregularity.

It is estimated that endometriosis affects 1 in 7 females, the majority between the ages of 14 and 44. There are currently over 830,000 in Australia and approximately 200 million worldwide!

On average, lost productivity and direct health expense costs in Australia are \$30,000 per patient per year. Endometriosis has many different symptoms that can vary from person to person and even with changing seasons. Some people may never experience any, which means it could take many years before endometriosis is formally diagnosed, possibly only by surgical intervention.

The reality couldn't be more evident: The number of women who suffer through this painful condition each year goes unnoticed, mainly because there's no way to get help without knowing what's happening inside their bodies!

### Typical treatment of pain from endometriosis:



NSAIDs, or non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medicines like ibuprofen, Motrin, and Tylenol, are commonly prescribed by doctors.

However, severe symptoms that do not respond to medication may require extensive surgery such as a [hysterectomy](#) (removal of the uterus, cervix and fallopian tubes)

## Is there a treatment alternative to harsh drugs?

Pulsed electromagnetic field therapy (PEMFT) has been used for many years to treat inflammation. As endometriosis is a painful inflammatory condition, low-intensity PEMF is a desirable alternative to using powerful and sometimes harmful medication.
